

# 2011 Trail to Eagle Program

Camp Resolute—We Do More  
August 7-12, 2011

**Please note that due to significant time restrictions this summer, no registrations for this program will be accepted after June 1st 2011.**

## **Eligibility and Conduct**

- A verification will be performed on all applicant's age and rank (age 13 and First Class by June 1st ), Hard Copy application and Code of Conduct signed by Scout, Parent or Guardian, and Scoutmaster required to attend. Trail to Eagle is best for those scouts, regardless of age, who are mature enough to work on their badges independently.
- Applicants are required to attend a pre-camp meeting to review expectations and pre-camp requirements
- Applicants are required to reside at camp for the entire week – this will not be a day camp program.
- All accepted Eagle Candidates are required to wear a complete scout uniform. Uniform shirt, shorts or slacks, belt, and socks. Class B Scout T-shirt, along with scout shorts/slacks, belt, and socks required for day use. Two Trail to Eagle T-Shirts will be issued to each candidate for day wear.
- All Eagle Candidates are responsible for completing Merit Badge Pre-requisites prior to camp—failure to do so will result in partials.
- All Eagle Scout Candidates are expected to behave in an appropriate and non-disruptive manner

## **Mandatory Pre-Camp Meeting and Eagle Seminar**

There will be a Mandatory Pre-Camp meeting on Wednesday August 3, 2011 for the 1st T to E Troop meeting at Resolute 7PM. The Advancement Committee's Trail to Eagle Seminar will be run this evening for parents and scouts. This will be open to anyone, even if your son isn't attending T to E camp. Starting time is 7:30PM.

### MB Pre-Camp Requirements

**Camping**—Provide own equipment for 7b, plus Scoutmaster note that you have completed 9a, 9b, and 9c

**Family Life**—2, 3, 4, 5

**First Aid**—1, 2d

**Citizenship in the Community**—2a (bring a map of your town), 3a, 7a, 7b, 7c (bring Scoutmaster note that you have completed the 8 hours of community service)

**Lifesaving**—1a, and must have Swimming MB

**Personal Management**—1, 2, 8b, 8c

**Citizenship in the Nation**—2, 3, 6 (come prepared with the speech you will discuss), 8 (send letter to congressman, bring a copy to camp)

**Swimming**—3, be able to pass the swimmer's test

Notes:

**Citizenship in the World**—Read pages 1-25 in the MD Booklet, be prepared to discuss req 1-3 during the 1st class, and Req 7 (depending on which 2 you choose to do)

^ - Environmental Science MB is very time consuming and will require scouts to spend time in an observation area and complete other work during personal time. Scouts are encouraged as to familiarize themselves with all requirements and complete many requirements possible to complete this badge in camp.

**Communications**—4, 5, if you choose 7b and 7c requires photos which you need to bring to camp or start the web page development to access from camp. 8 requires securing your T to E Patrol Leaders Council approval

**Emergency Preparedness**—2c, 8c and First Aid MB
